## 3.3.2.2 Heathrow Airport, London

Completed in 2016, The Garden Gate (Gate 25, Terminal 3) living wall covers an area of  $35m^2$  [6]. It is a Biotecture hydroponic system. The design is an organic, curvilinear pattern to create the effect of enlarging the space. Plants were chosen to suit interior conditions of lower, filtered light levels (supplemented with horticultural lighting), with good air circulation and temperatures of  $17^{\circ}C$  and above. Consideration was also taken to ensure there are no berries, prickles or sap which may cause irritation, as well as low levels of pollen (of types not generally associated with hay fever). Several plants were selected particularly for their known properties for purifying air pollutants, such as benzene, formaldehyde, trichloroethylene, xylene and toluene ammonia. The plants are all evergreen and were also selected for their colour, form and textures. The colour palette is of lush greens, with red, white and silver accents.
